




Contributed to the success of various events, including Party on the Pointe, Light Up Main Street, Eggstravaganza, Zombie Run, Dia de Los Libros, Halloween Fiesta and Haunted House, Thanksgiving Community Dinners, and Family Literacy Festival, among others



2,200 Youth, 220 Teams

Coached and mentored over 2.200 youth participants in 220 Youth Sports teams and allowed leagues to grow and accommodate more participants



New Trails

Made it possible for the City of Santa Clarita to be the first section of the new Crest-to-Coast Trail and provided a crucial connection to dozens of trails in **SCV**

Built over five miles of new trails. added new mileage to Gates Trail and Romo Trail, helped create the new Rattlesnake Run and Heritage Bypass Trail, and maintained over 25 miles of trails at various Open Space properties



Little Free Libraries

Installed two Little Free Libraries in Needham Ranch and Newhall Pass Open Space as part of an Eagle Scout project



New Routes and Ladder Drop Features

Developed new routes and landings for three new ladder drop features at the Trek Bike Park of Santa Clarita and assisted with track repair of the BMX and pump tracks

Cleaned up a Newhall neighborhood by painting, picking during the Preserving Newhall Community Day



New Roving Archery Range

Built the Roving Archery Range, a walking path that leads to shooting stations with rubber animals as targets

Wildlife Habitat
