



VOLUNTEER IMPACT

PRESIDENT'S VOLUNTEER SERVICE AWARD (PVSA)

- 13,046 hours contributed by 57
 outstanding volunteers who
 received the President's
 Volunteer Service Award for their
 positive impact on the community
 and inspiring others to take action
- Over 4,000 volunteer hours given by the City's first PVSA Lifetime Service Awardee

EVENTS

- Instrumental to the success of 29 events enjoyed by thousands of residents
- Provided a fun and safe Cowboy Festival after three years of absence
- Helped the City honor various cultures through the Celebrate event series

YOUTH SPORTS

 Allowed leagues to grow by coaching and mentoring 2,800 youth in 310 teams, an increase of 27% and 41%, respectively, from 2022



OPEN SPACE & TRAILS

- 3 new trails built Bear Trail, East Walker Ranch Forest Trail, and Agua Dulce Canyon Trail
- 3 trailheads improved bridge installed at Pine Street Trailhead as part of an Eagle Scout project, dead tree removed at San Francisquito Trailhead, and brush cleared at Agua Dulce Canyon Trailhead parking lot
- 35 miles of trails maintained and made safe for hikers, bikers and horse riders
- Contributed valuable data to biodiversity research in the Golden Valley Ranch Open Space through the first-ever Bioblitz project, with 82 species identified and 270 observations recorded
- Supported the Sister Cities
 Charity Hike by ensuring that the
 Elder Trail was clear and safe for
 all participants



VOLUNTEER IMPACT

COMMUNITY BEAUTIFICATION

- 12,700 lbs. of trash and debris picked up during River Rally, including 1,100 lbs. diverted to landfill for recycling
- 360 feet of wall painted on Whites Canyon Road and Soledad Canyon Road
- 140 cubic yards of mulch spread over half a mile of parkways on Whites Canyon Road
- Cleaned up trail at Haskell
 Canyon Open Space in
 preparation for the Community
 Hike and the Taylor Trail in
 preparation for the Hiking
 Challenge
- Beautified the Newhall
 Community Center by planting
 flowers and shrubs throughout
 the exterior of the facility
- Made significant contributions to nine projects that benefited the City and various nonprofits during Make a Difference Day

LIBRARIES

- Over 2,800 Summer Reading Program participants served
- Enhanced library programs through funds raised from Bag Sales
- Successfully assisted in the creation and filming of marketing videos

COMMUNITY CENTERS

- Brought smiles to over 800
 residents during the Thanksgiving
 Community Dinners in both the
 Newhall and Canyon Country
 Community Centers
- Helped provide fun and engaging activities for event and program participants
- Made the return of Folklorico
